Biographical/Historical Note

In the 1850s, Fredonia's citizens noted the increasingly urgent need to expand their cemetery. As a result, the Forest Hill Cemetery Association was organized in 1854 by 39 citizens, including, but not limited to, Roselle Greene, David Barrel, A.Z. Madison, Jacob Houghton, Willard McKinstry, and Levi Risley. The first task of the new cemetery association was to purchase land for burial purposes, and nine acres were purchased adjoining the Chautauqua Farmers and Mechanics Union Fairgrounds. These original nine acres were not enough, and between 1859-1870, the purchase of the fairgrounds resulted in an additional 18 acres added to the cemetery's property. This ensured there was enough land to bury Fredonians for generations to come, and also eliminated the "annoyance" caused by horse races occurring at the same time as funerals. The Forest Hill Cemetery Association trustees oversaw all administrative matters of Forest Hill Cemetery until the Town of Pomfret took over management of the cemetery in the 1990s.
